THE SPICE COMMON BUYERS GROUP – INITIATING COOPERATION IN PROCUREMENT

SPICE gives public authorities an invaluable opportunity to **share their experiences** of procuring innovative sustainable transportation solutions and to learn from each other. Now SPICE is encouraging public authorities to take the **next steps towards cooperating** when procuring innovative mobility solutions. **SPICE supports the process of bringing potential partners together** to shape and initiate cooperation. SPICE can organise the first meetings or offer some advice on how and on which parts of the procurement process to cooperate on, or just provide a forum to discuss common issues and learn from one another.

Based on the information collected in previous phase of the SPICE project, **four different types of cooperation** in Public Procurement are identified:



A **SWOT analysis** has been carried out to identify all strengths, weaknesses, opportunities and threats of joint procurements. Strengths are found in the **innovative potential** of cooperation, the **reduced costs** and **higher quality** of the solutions. On the other hand, weaknesses are found in the time and resource demanding elements of joint procurement, e.g. due to the highly **complex contracts** and needs for mutual consent, adding extra risks of failing to the project. Threats of joint procurement are ranging from an **inflexible administrative structure** with many rules and laws, **language barriers**, and a possible **lack of willingness and trust**. Sharing best practises and providing peer-to-peer support will help to overcome these hindrances.

SPICE OBJECTIVES



- Form a number of Common Buyers Groups to facilitate joint procurement during and after the project timeframe

- Initiate an support a number of Common Buyers Groups; within a group buyers work together towards a common procurement

- Identify the common needs, support the partnership building

- Provide framework to develop the practices and procedures by identifying best practices, creating recommendations and providing peer-to-peer support for procurers
